ELIGIBILITY

- Employed Canadian PGA Class 'A' Professionals or Apprentices or Candidates for Membership or Teaching Professionals (Not Head Teaching Professionals) who are currently employed (as defined in the Canadian PGA By-Laws and Categories of Membership). Those eligible must remain employed throughout the Championship.
- Eligible Members, Apprentices and Candidates for Membership as defined in (a) above MUST NOT have played in more than two Canadian or foreign tour events in the period April 1, 2009 to September 28, 2010.
- The Canadian Open is not included in the restrictions stated in (b) above.

ENTRY DEADLINE

Entries close at 4:00 p.m. (Eastern Daylight Time) on Friday September 17 2010. Time limit for entries means time of receipt at Canadian PGA National Office (**not time of postmark**). Applications late or incomplete are not acceptable. No telephone entries will be accepted. Therefore, contestants are encouraged to allow ample time for mail delays or error in transmission of their entries. Members who desire to play in the Championship, including those whose name appears on the priority list, MUST submit an entry form prior to the entry deadline. Entries will not be accepted without full remittance of an entry fee.

ENTRY FEE

\$414.40 (\$370.00 plus applicable taxes).

REFUND POLICY

Entrants who cancel in writing before the entry deadline stated on the applicable entry form will receive a refund of their entry fee. Entrants who cancel after the entry deadline stated on the applicable entry form (up to 12 noon EDT Friday, September 24th, 2010) will receive a refund minus a \$75 Service Charge. There will be no refunds for any reason after Friday September 24th, 2010 (12 noon EDT) of tournament week.

CADDIES

Caddies are permitted but are not mandatory. Limited caddies may be available at the host club. Host clubs will attempt to assist competitors with their caddie requirements, but neither the CPGA nor the host clubs are responsible for securing caddies for competitors. Competitors may carry their own clubs or use a pull cart.

FOOTWEAR - GOLF SPIKES

It is a condition of the competition that shoes with metal or traditionally designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) not be worn. This rule also applies to amateurs in the Pro-Sponsor Day (there will be none this year). Penalty for breach of this condition: DISQUALIFICATION.

ENTRY PRIORITY LIST

Those members whose names appear on the priority list, or fall into a listed category must enter the Championship by Wednesday, August 23rd 2010 or forfeit their status on the priority list. After that date, those on the priority list may enter subject to availability. The remainder of the field will consist of entries first received at the Canadian PGA National Office by the entry deadline until the field is filled. The maximum field size is 132. Subsequent entries will be placed on an alternate list according to the order in which they are received at the National Office.

Please consult the registration list after August 23, 2010 to confirm your entry.

Those whose names appear on the list must also meet eligibility requirements to enter the Championship. Professionals who desire to play in the Championship, including those whose names are on the priority list must submit an entry form prior to the entry deadline. Each player is responsible for his own entry.

- 2009 Canadian PGA Assistant Zone Champions.
- One Assistant from the host club.
- Inter-Zone team members from each Zone. (Team members' entries must be received prior to entry deadline.)
- Five special Canadian PGA exemptions.

TIME OF STARTING

All players in a group must be present and READY TO PLAY at the time laid down by the Committee. The order of play is not relevant. READY TO PLAY is defined as being on or near the player's first tee accompanied with the necessary equipment needed to put a ball in play. Notification by a Canadian PGA Rules Official will be given to late starters on the first tee or as soon as practicable.

RULES AND LOCAL RULES

The Rules of the Royal Canadian Golf Association/United States Golf Association govern play as modified by the Nationwide PGA TOUR Local Rules and Conditions of Competitions. Supplementary Local Rules will be given to each competitor at the player's first tee. Local Rules on the host club score cards shall not apply.

AUTOMOTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Players shall walk at all times during a stipulated round, except when permitted to ride by a Canadian PGA Rules Official. Penalty: Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round: four (4) strokes. In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole. Use of any unauthorized automotive vehicle shall be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Otherwise, the player shall be disqualified.

CLOSE OF THE COMPETITION

When all scores have been approved by the Canadian PGA, the result of the competition is deemed to have been officially announced and the competition closed.

TIES

Any competitor involved in a playoff, and not immediately available, takes last playoff position. Multiple no-shows for playoffs shall be decided by lot.

PRIZE MONEY – TIES

In the event of ties, prize money will be divided equally among those tied, except that if a competitor wins a playoff for the Championship, he or she will receive first place prize money.

**CHAMPIONSHIP ROUNDS - 54-holes, stroke play
Maximum field - 132 competitors**

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 28 - Championship first round, 18-holes; Inter-Zone Team Championship first round, 18-holes.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29 - Championship second round, 18-holes; Inter-Zone Team Championship final round, 18-holes.

36-HOLE CUT: 60 lowest scorers and any tying for 60th place continue play September 29, 2010. Remainder eliminated after 36-holes.

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 - Third round, 18-holes. Lowest scorer for 54-hole will be champion. In the event of a tie for first place, there will be a hole-by-hole playoff until a champion is determined.

NAMING INTER-ZONE TEAM

Team members' entries must be received prior to the entry deadline. Zones must declare their four-man team by 1:00 p.m. (EDT) on September 3, 2010 only from professionals who have entered prior to the entry deadline. A minimum of four (4) players is required to enter a team.

INTER-ZONE TEAM FORMAT

Each team's best three (3) 18-hole scores for each day of the 36-hole competition (the first two rounds of the Championship) shall count. In the event of a tie for first place, each team's fourth place 18-hole score for the final round of Inter-zone team competition will be used to determine the champion. If still tied, each team involved in the tie will be asked to designate one team member to playoff during the final round of the Championship proper, the lower or lowest 18-hole score determining the champion. Should this result in a tie, the teams tied will be deemed co-champions.
